This will include improved rural infrastructure, Improved agricultural support and rural financial services, increasing diversification of household economic activities, and the creation of on-and off-farm livelihood opportunities

Tonle Sap Poverty Reduction and Smallholder Development Project (TSSD) was approved on 8 December 2009 and declared effective on 31 March 2010 within budget and in accordance with Government, ADB, IFAD and Government of Finland.

15. PROJECT JUSTIFICATION: (Give reasons why this particular project is considered worthwhile.)

Cambodia has achieved a GDP growth of 8-10 percent a year since 2001, driven largely by an expansion of the construction, garment, and tourism sectors. Agriculture growth has fluctuated because of variations in the performance of the crop sector, especially rice. However the RGC and its development partners are deeply concerned about (i) the narrow base of economic growth, currently threatened by the global economic crisis; and (ii) the persistence of high levels of rural poverty, coupled with the income disparity between rural urban areas.

16. BENIFITS: (Who will benefit, directly and indirectly, from the project?)

The Project is expected to benefit about 630,000 household (or about 2.5 million people) in 5 provinces through investment, training and capacity building, and field demonstrations of improved livelihood practices and follow-ups.
