NR5 is an important highway for both domestic and international transport in ASEAN and Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS). The improvement of the road and other structures between Thlea Ma'am and Battambang and between Sri Sophorn and Poipet (Middle Section) along the National Road No. 5, will complement the two JICA ongoing projects located along the Northern and Southern segments of National Road No. 5, namely:

- 1) North Section: Battambang Sri Sophorn Section (L/A: CP-P13 and CP-P20)
- 2) South Section: Prek Kdam Thlea Ma'am Section (L/A: CP-P16 and CP-P19)

The three (3) road sections (North, South and Middle) will complete the improvement of the National Road No. 5 that connects three major cities of Bangkok (Thailand), Phnom Penh (Cambodia) and Ho Chi Minh City (Vietnam). This is sought to a more reliable, safer, more comfortable, and faster means of transport and will further contribute to the economic development of Cambodia.
