The project is financed by the International Fund for Agriculture Development (IFAD) through the Ministry of Economy and Finance (MEF) with counterpart contributions from the Royal Government of Cambodia. Three project implementation partners: United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO); the Netherlands Development Organisation (SNV) and International Development Enterprises also make contributions to project costs from their own resources.
